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Future leader travels world

Seniors preparing for graduation are filled with hopes and dreams for a bright future. Some focus on college, some think about family, and some young minds concentrate on the impact they can make on the world around them. Globe senior Rachel O'Malia is an innovative student that might just change the world. Her intelligence and fearless ambition has already taken her half way around the globe for an educational program that changed her life.

In the summer of 2013 O'Malia traveled to Madagascar with the Frontier program where she focused on wildlife conservation, marine conservation, and teaching English. "I was actually invited by the program because of my interests," said O'Malia. "I received a few grants to go so I only had to pay for my plane ticket and any souvenirs I wanted to buy." During her trip O'Malia spent a month and a half in a place called Hell-ville and on an island known as Nosy be. "We actually taught English to young students," said O'Malia. "By the time they were 6 or 7 years old they were already speaking three languages so we were teaching them their fourth language." O'Malia also noted that the program offered an adult class for

adults who wanted to learn English in the evenings. "I still keep in contact with some of the students from the adult class," said O'Malia.

In the wildlife program, O'Malia participated in a group study that took surveys of the creatures in the forest and on the plateaus. "We discovered a new species of lemur," said O'Malia. "About 90 percent of the animals in Madagascar have not been identified yet, and the guy who found the lemur actually got to name him so how cool is that."

Through the marine conservation program O'Malia was taught how to scuba dive. "We measured coral, played with sea turtles, and counted fish," said O'Malia. "It was an amazing experience."

Traveling to Madagascar and experiencing such broad educational opportunities has made a significant impact on O'Malia. "It definitely opened my eyes to just how many things are out there," said O'Malia. "Coming from a small town you don't really know what's out there, this experience has taught me to go learn as much as I can."

In the fall O'Malia will take another big step toward

her promising future. She was awarded Arizona State University's Leadership Scholarship. "It's a full tuition scholarship," said O'Malia. "It's a great program that automatically signs you up for other clubs and places you in leadership classes."

In order to be considered for the scholarship O'Malia had to write a few essays and a speech about her passions. "I wrote about traveling of course," said O'Malia. There was also a five hour interview process where she was able to meet people already in the program and answer questions about her thoughts on leadership.

"Right now I'm looking at going into forensics but when I was in Madagascar I found a new passion for psychology," said O'Malia. "I may do a double major."

O'Malia's positive outlook is inspired by her mother. "She motivates me to do anything I want," said O'Malia. "No matter how crazy it is, like going half way around the world."

The future is almost blinding for this Globe senior. "I see myself traveling the world," said O'Malia. "The trick is finding a career that will pay me to do that."

Globe senior Amanda Knauss is no ordinary teenager. As a young author with an inventive mind, Knauss's dreams go beyond college and straight into the pages of her unique and complex manuscripts.

"I started writing when I was eight and it's always stuck with me," said Knauss. "I've always been really creative." At the age of 14, Knauss got an idea to create a comic book type universe and put it in novel format. "I wrote the book 'Snaring Night' when I was 15," said Knauss. At age 16 she published the novel with an Amazon company called CreateSpace. The company offers free tools to help authors self-publish and distribute their books. "I think I've sold maybe 200 or 300 copies," said Knauss. Amazon describes "Snaring Night" as a "not-so-ordinary teen novel; losing all control, dysfunctional families, chasing down a psychotic mother, explosions, sharp objects, awkward moments, battles, more explosions that defy physics, love, loss, and restoration of relationships." Amazon goes on to say that the novel is "written from a teen's perspective using humor, science fiction, and misfits to tackle problems in life."

Since publishing her first novel, Knauss has successfully written two more books. She admitted that she thought

the other two books were better maybe because she was a little older when she wrote them. "Right now I'm working on a stand alone novel that I can't tell you about because I don't want to give away any spoilers," said Knauss. As an intelligent young author, Knauss finds herself intrigued by super heroes, science fiction, and Star Wars. "I'm a huge geek," proclaimed Knauss. "Stan Lee and Peter Jackson are my biggest inspirations."

Knauss's creativity stems from hours of writing and delving deep into her craft. "I love doing character development," said Knauss. "I love writing fight scenes and describing the setting, and it's really fun to show both sides of humanity when developing a story."

As graduation nears, Knauss has finalized her plans for after high school. "After I graduate I plan on shipping out to basic training," said Knauss. "The military is going to pay for my college." Knauss plans on joining the Reserves and serving six years. Once she's done with basic training she plans on attending Grand Canyon University for film making with an emphasis on production. 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

In 10 years I will be finishing my residency as a dermatologist and beginning my career.

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




